Today's Hymns and Readings for Your Participation in the Divine Liturgy

Second Antiphon and Entrance

O Son of God, who came seated on the foal of an ass, save us who sing to Thee, *Alleluia*.

Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) of Palm Sunday

Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord: God is the Lord and hath appeared unto us. Save us, O Son of God, Who didst sit upon the foal of an ass; who sing to Thee. *Alleluia*.

Apolytikion of Lazarus Saturday Tone 1

In confirming the common Resurrection, O Christ God, Thou didst raise up Lazarus from the dead before Thy Passion. Wherefore, we also, like the children, bearing the symbols of victory, cry to Thee, the Vanquisher of death: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

Apolytikion of Palm Sunday Tone 4

As by baptism we were buried with Thee, O Christ our God, so by Thy Resurrection we were deemed worthy of immortal life; and praising Thee, we cry: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

Kontakion of Palm Sunday Tone 6

Being borne upon a throne in Heaven, and upon a colt on the earth, O Christ God, Thou didst accept the praise of the angels and the laudation of the children as they cried to Thee: Blessed art Thou Who comest to recall Adam.

Prokeimenon

Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord. O give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good; for His mercy endures forever.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Philippians (4:4-9)

Brethren, rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let all men know your for-

bearance. The Lord is at hand. Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, these do; and the God of peace will be with you.

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John (12:1-18)

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus who had died was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they made Him a supper; Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at table with Him. Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped His feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. But Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, one of His Disciples (he who was to betray Jesus), said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not because he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the moneybox he used to take what was put into it. Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of My burial. The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have Me." When the great crowd of the Jews learned that He was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus. The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So

they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His Disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of Him and had been done to Him. The crowd that had been with Jesus when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet

Jesus was that they heard He had done this sign.

Koinonikon for Palm Sunday

Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord. Alleluia.

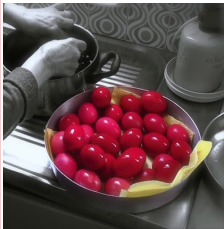

The Tradition of Red Dyed Eggs for Pascha



We bring red hard boiled eggs to Liturgy on Pascha for the priest to hand out after Liturgy during blessings. Collectively more that 500 eggs are needed for this tradition. **If you are dyeing eggs to bring to the feast PLEASE REMEMBER:**

- ◆ ***The hard boiled eggs should be dyed on Holy Thursday.*** Elizabeth Sharon Yocum will be at the hall kitchen to dye eggs with other ladies on Holy Thursday following morning services. If you want to do this with her, please contact her at 909-553-6252 or email her at shar4j@gmail.com. You will need to bring eggs. If you are dyeing eggs at home, contact Elizabeth to get the dye.
- ◆ **MAKE SURE EGGS ARE DRY WHEN YOU BRING THEM TO THE PASCHAL LITURGY** Wet eggs drip red stain onto the temple floor, vestments and parishioner clothing. Not a good thing. If they are not dry, save them for your celebration at home. If you refrigerate them, moisture will condense on the outside when you remove them. Make sure they have dried from this before bringing them to Liturgy.

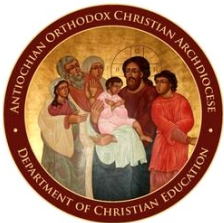
WE'RE BUILDING A HOUSE!
